## Why quality of life?

- Policies targeting only GDP growth might not bring about overall progress and well-being of the society
- Quality of life: a multi-faceted and human-oriented concept
- Corresponds with the UN SDGs
- Much more challenging to be measured

## Dimensions of quality of life

#### **EUROSTAT: 8+1 dimensions**

- Material living conditions (income, consumption and material conditions)
- Productive or main activity
- Health
- Education
- Leisure and social interactions
- Economic and physical safety
- Governance and basic rights
- Natural and living environment
- Overall experience of life

#### **OECD: 11 dimensions**

- Income
- Access to services
- Jobs
- Health
- Education
- Community
- Civic Engagement
- Safety
- Environment
- Housing
- Life satisfaction



## Indicators on quality of life

#### **Subjective (perceived)**

- Direct public opinion enquiry
- Characterize individuals or their immediate surroundings
- In-depth interview (EU SILC)
   Small sample size
- Perception survey (Eurobarometer)
   Only 79 cities
- Might be relative subject to cultural norms, awareness, etc.


#### **Objective** (measured)

- Indicators derived from 'hard' data
- Characterize aggregate populations, wider geographic areas
- Proxy variables
- Decennial census, admin. registers
- Urban statistics
- Spatial data
- Models, predictions

Flash Eurobarometer 419, May-June 2015 79 selected cities 500 respondents per city






## Subjective indicators: air quality

Generally speaking, please tell me if you are satisfied with the quality of the air in your city.






#### Objective indicators: air quality

Exposure of vulnerable populations to polluted air

(NO<sub>2</sub> concentration over recommended threshold)



UDP interface relating Urban Indicators to SDGs.




#### Safety compared through Urban Data Platform

Road traffic fatalities rate






